In a few days we will be meeting in Buenos Aires for the 65th FIAF Congress.

There will be two special evenings: one on May 25th, at the Maipo, with the presentation of the 1927 Argentine silent Perdón viejita, in concert; and a second on May 26th, at the Teatro EL Globo, with Expedición Stoessel, with live musical accompaniment.

There will also be a photographic exhibition on display, México fotografiado por Buñuel, together with an outstanding film retrospective.

We expect this experience to reach far beyond the professional events, the Symposium, the Second Century Forum, the Workshops, and the General Assembly, and we look forward to sharing some moments of leisure, with excursions to the Delta of the River Plate, the Tigre district, and the charming city of San Isidro.

Throughout the time we spend together, we hope that you will feel part of the family of the Cinemateca Argentina and the Museo del Cine.

Buenos Aires awaits you with open arms.

## **II** THE SECOND CENTURY FORUM

The contemporary era of the digital market is presenting film archives and museums with new challenges that bring into question their identity. A key aspect of this situation is the need to reconsider the idea of film heritage as cultural patrimony for the future. The Second Century Forum in Buenos Aires will consider three approaches to this question:


- A) What can FIAF archives and museums do in this respect?
- B) How can we rise awareness outside FIAF about this aspect?
- C) What models can other institutions that take care of cultural patrimony offer to film archives and museums?

Paolo Cherchi Usai, David Francis, Michael Loebenstein, in collaboration with Programming and Access to Collections Commission will explore the issues, the strategies and the tools necessary to find solutions. The Second Century Forum will address such topics as: the need for selection; the need for shared access criteria; the need to preserve the cinematic event; film heritage as 'unique' cultural objects; memory vs repository; culture and market; public and private sectors. The Second Century Forum has been designed as an open discussion with FIAF members' active participation in three consecutive workshop-like sessions devoted to SELECTION, ACCESS and EXPERIENCE/EVENT.

## MUSUEM OF TIGRE

The Art Museum of Tigre is placed in the former Tigre Social Club. Founded in 1910, it was furnished with a casino in 1927. It was a place for meeting and leisure for the Argentine upper class and a symbol of the Belle Époque in Argentina at the time of the agricultural exports model.

The French firm Dubois and Pater, composed by Pablo Eugene Pater and Luis Dubois, was in charge of the project.

In 1979 the building was awarded cultural heritage designation, and in the 90's the Town Council of Tigre reassigned its facilities to art museum, creating the current Museo de Arte Tigre (MAT) (The Art Museum of Tigre), which opened to the public in 2006.

The MAT is one of the best equipped museums as regards museistic quality, with state of the art humidification and climatization equipments, as well as specialized staff in all the museum departments.

The Museum attracts a large number of visitors and appeals to public of different ages and sectors, including a high percentage of foreign guests.

## THE COLLECTION

The Museum's heritage includes a collection of Argentine Figurative Art of the 19th and 20th centuries and classical paintings of Argentine painting forerunners such as Carlos Pellegrini, Juan León Palliére and Juan Mauricio Rugendas, among others. Masters like Antonio Berni, Raúl Soldi, Eduardo Sívori, Benito Quinquela Martín, Carlos Castagnino, Florencio Molina Campos, Pío Collivadino and Lino Enea Spilimbergo, are also present.

On 28 April, The Art Museum of Tigre opens the exhibition: Carlos Alonso and Carlos de la Mota in Tigre

The exhibition pays tribute to these two masters of Argentine Painting who celebrate 80 years of art.

It is a pleasure to show this joint exhibition of Carlos Alonso and Carlos de la Mota. The work of two acclaimed Argentine artists, whose careers stand out for their strong commitment to the social situation of our country, is now on show at the Museum of Tigre for us to enjoy.

An artist's creation is legitimized when it can touch and even move us.

Either in Alonso's or in De la Mota's work the symbolic elements are at times displayed, at others concealed or veiled; they even undermine the historically conditioned cultural categories. Some are lost, others become worn down, while new ones emerge. A viewer in deep contemplation of the works of art created by these two master artists, lives, reads and shares all that opens and closes around him or her, until feeling the revealing shudder.

# Useful Information



#### EATING OUT

We have selected a number of restaurants in the neighbourhood of the CTBA (Complejo Teatral de Buenos Aires) which will have special offerings for our guests. They will be identified with the logo of the Congress. Please note that service charges (10% of the bill) are not included in the total price.

#### UNDERGROUND AND BUS TICKETS

Buenos Aires has five underground (Subte) lines: A, B, C, D, and E. The price of one trip is AR\$1.10 (US\$.30). Cards for 2, 5, and 10 trips are available.

The city's bus (colectivos) network has significant coverage. The minimum bus ticket price is AR\$1.10, up to AR\$1.25 per trip.

#### TAXIS

Taxis can be hailed in the street. They are normally safe, but there are also radio taxi companies, for your comfort and security. You will be given the telephone numbers for some taxi companies. Taxi's fares are very good.

#### AIRPORT SERVICES

Ezeiza International Airport has currency exchange offices inside, as well as a branch of the national bank, the Banco de la Nación Argentina. There is also a call centre where you can make international calls, and Internet connection.

Through our travel agent, Ryan's Travel, we will send you different options to get to the City of Buenos Aires, which you can arrange beforehand.

We would also suggest that you use the companies in the booths in the passenger exit area. Taking a taxi at the entrance of the airport would not be advisable.

### ELECTRIC POWER

Argentina has 220 V power.

#### TEMPERATURE

Buenos Aires has a mild climate, but it is rather unpredictable. The temperature changes a lot throughout the day, with colder mornings and evenings and warmer mid-days and afternoons. The average temperature at the time of the Congress is expected to be 15°C (59°F), with a minimum temperature of 10°C (50°F). Sometimes it may be rainy. The city has a high relative humidity average. Autumn clothes are advisable.

#### TIME

The time difference with Europe at the time of the Congress is +5 hours, Tokyo +12 hours, and New York -1 hour.
