## MUSED DEL CINEMA

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INTERNATIONAL FEDERATION OF FILM ARCHIVES
REPORT ON THE ACTIVITIES OF THE MUSED DEL CINEMA IN 1964

During 1964 the Museo del Cinema was visited by nearly 35.000 visitors. Among the most distinguished ones, were prof. Gerald Noxon and Dr. Robert Steele, from the University of Boston: they came in July with the students of the Interne= tional Institute for Advanced Studies in Cinema, from Vence (France), where their courses were held, and spent fourdays at the Museum. Another visit is being ache= duled for the summer of 1965 .

From January to June, and in November and December 1964, thirty-eight films were shown at the Museum, grouped in the following programs: "Homage to Pietro Germi" (six films), "Homage to Burt Lancaster" (Five films), "Jean Paul Sarto's Works in Cinema" (Four films'), "Homage to Kenji Mizogudi" (three films), "Homage to Sidney Lumet" (three films), "Indipendent Cinema in the U.S.A." (twelve films), "Soviet films" (five films). As an addition to this last program, seven Soviet films were show h from October 20 th to the 26 th for the members of the Ital= lian-USSR Association*

For the fiftieth anniversary of the "presière" of Giovanni Pastrone's CABIRIA (Torino, April 18, 1914), a special show of this film was organized at the Museum on the 18th of April, 1964.

In January and February special film sessions in English were organ= nized for the students of this language: forty documentaries were presented on Saturday afternoons; the documentaries were bent by the British Consulate in Turin and the Embassy of India in Rome*

The film program till June 1965 includesnemeight films by Jean Gremillon (introduced bye a press conference of Pierre Mast at the Museum, on ( $1 n$ cooperation with the Cinematheque ${ }^{2}$ wancaise January lith) four films by Elia Kazan, four films with Laurence Olivier and four with Marilyn Monroe.

From December 1963 to May 1964, five film clubs were organized for youngsters between 11 and 15 years of age (two in Turin, and three in neighbouring

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towns). The films presented were 12 for each group; the youngsters, who attended these sessions, were approximately 400 . Discussions, led by en adult expert, were held after each projection, recordea on tapes, and then written down they are now available at the Library of the Museum, in Turin, and in Rome at the Centro Nazionale Film per la Gioventù and at the Comitato per la Cinematografia dei Ragazzi. These film clubs are being organized again during the 1964-65 school year.

In 1964 the Museum published the "ATTI del $1^{\circ}$ corso per Animatori di Cine Club per Ragazzi" (a booklet of 131 pages, with lectures and discussions from the first three-day course for youth-minilm club leaders, held at the Museum on September 26 to 28, 1963) . A booklet on Jean Grémillodi is actually being pre $=$ pared with the University Film Club of Turin, and will be ready in March 1965: it will be the third issue of the magazine CENPROFILM, sponsored by the Museo del Cinema.

The travelling"Sxhibition of Caricatures in Photography and Cinema XI्C 1839-1939" went to Lardere110 in February, Aosta in March and Bordighera in July. Material from the Kaseum's collections was sent to Sorrento in September for the "Frhibition of Famous Film Stars".

The Museo del Cinema was represented by the Director, prof. Maria Adriam na Prolo, at the National Convention of the Italian Museum Directors in Sicily (June), at the meeting of the film historians in Venice, and at the Venice Film Festival; by the Assistant Director, Dr. Roberto Ruffino, at the Second Inter= national Film Week in Sorrento; by the Librarian, Dr. Roberto Radicati di Marmorito, at the Iatin American Film Festival in Sestri Levante, and at the Indipendent Film Festival in Porretta Terme *

On October 9th, 1964, the Assistant Director visited Mr. CKXXXXXXX Charles Chaplin in his home at Corsier sur Vevey (Switzerland); Mr. Chaplin signed a copy

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of this Autobiography and other precioud docyments from the Museum's collections, and promised to visit the Museum in the near future.

For the Autumn of 1965 (it is almost certain), the Museo del Cinema is planning an "Exhibition of Stereoscopy", from photography up to present day threedimensional cinema. A catalogue of the exhibition shall be published.

Plans are also proceeding for the new building, that shall house the Museum in the future years; they are sponsored by the City Administration of Turin. The area chosen for this project is a park on the banks of the Po river, which already includes two museums (automobiles and aerohautics) and an interna= tional school (controlled by the Bureau International du Travail) *or students from under-developed countries.
