Points for the FIAF Executive, New York, Apr 1980

1. STAFF

We are now employing the following staff:

All staff except the editor are on the middle points of their pay scales with two or three steps to progress. When the 1978/profits are starting to flow in (ie. after we have paid the printing & publishing costs, and the difficit envisaged in the 1980 & 1981 Accounts), the following priorities need to be met:

- a) the Information Assistant's time needs to be expanded if we are to keep up-to-date at all with both Indexes im 1980 & 1981. I envisage to about 20-24 hrs per week (ie needing a further £1500 pa)
- b) the Printer should also be paid at a rate more comensurate with his specialist abilities and his importance to the Indexes
- c) the Editor's work has expanded very considerably from the days when it was based on Grade 8 of the BFI's scale. Another 20 or so periodical titles have been added to the Film Index, the TV Index has been launched, and the production and sales of the annual volumes are now added to the Editor's work. I would like the Executive to consider how a new pay scale may be worked out, either by regrading the post or by increasing the existing scale.

2. ACCOMODATION

The new offices are working out very well and I don't know what we would have done without them for storage of the card sets, annual volumes and packing envelopes.

Even so, I wish to dispose of the old card sets (1973-1977) and keep, as a matter of policy, the past two years only. These back sets have been offered to FIAF members through the Bulletin and I think have no further chance of exploitation.

The arrangements with Infodoc Services are also working well.

3. INFODOC SERVICES LTD

The Agreement has been sent to several members for approval. It is working well. Infodoc is reimbursing FIAF for 30% of the expenses involved with the East suite of offices. The assignment of the Lease is finally completed.

4. INDEX ANNUAL VOLUMES

There has been a delay with the printing of the 1978 volume in New York. Out printing 'broker' who was recommended by St James has had delays in getting the printing done and estimates that it will now be completed by April 20. We decided to print in the States because the prices were very competitive (nearly £2000 + cheaper than UK estimates) and normally a few weeks delay would not be so bad. At the moment a delay in the 1978 volume is terrible.

Publicity brochures have been sent to major film and arts organizations, universities, film schools, bbok shops and contacts in Europe, Latin America, North America, Australia, New Zealand etc. Supplies of bruthures are also being distributed by some FIAF archives. All previous customers of Macmillan and St Martin's have also been circulated.

The Australian Film Institute has offered to handle 200 copies for us charging a handling fee of about £3.30. A copy of their letter is enclosed, I have agreed this for 1978.

St Martin's are taking 300 copies of 1978 at £10.50. The arrangements for 1979 will be that the American Film Institute takes some volumes, I hope 300 but have had no reply on the details of the arrangement yet to my letter of last December.

The Australian Film Institute will take 200 if the arrangement with 1978 is satisfactory, leaving 500 copies to be sold from London. I would like to print again in the States, the paste-up is starting here already and this time we will have the volume ready by August/September 1980. I am confident that the paste-up, which delayed the 1978 volume from March - November, will be completed by May as it is being done in the office by my husband!

A special note has been sent to all the film periodicals which we index about the change of publisher.

I have also invoiced all FIAF members for 1 copy at the cost price of £10. Additional copies will need to be paid for at the full rate £6 £30, or £25 if a Standing Order is made. I have not invoiced Observers as I did not know what was decided as a rate for them. I was very against giving away free copies which would cost us the £460 which we will receive

from members at cost price. Our financial situation does not make this possible yet.

A budget for the 1978 volume is enclosed, I do not foresee much difference for the 1979 volume if it can be printed during the summer.

5. TV INDEX

We have at present 26 subscribers to this service. We need to have a campaign to get more TV companies to subscribe but I have had no time to devote to this. I had hoped that our link with FIAT would help but nothing has come of it, even the members of their Executive do not subscribe.

I hope that the Documentation Commission can invite M. Castellani to its next meeting so that the problem can be discussed. I have already written to him concerning the lack of representation of documentation specialists in FIAT, most of the representatives come from the film & video libraries, not the documentation collections: he agrees that FIAT should involve itself in this subject. Suggestions for new TV periodicals would be welcomed. I think that an annual volume would sell well and would like to produce one. However, I think it is not possible to find time to do it this year. What I would like to do is to consider a combined volume of the 1979 & 1980 cards to appear in 1981 when we can, hopefully, give more time to it.

Our original estimate of about 2,000 entries pa seems to be correct, so that if we did produce a combined volume for two years if would be about half the size of the Film volume ie about 340 pages in A4. This would mean a production cost of about £3,000 if we printed 1,000 copies. We could then sell at about £10 - £12 and recover our costs after selling 300 copies. In view of the small size of the TV Index this pattern of publishing every 2 years be a better format than an annual volume.

6. UNESCO CONTRACT

Now that Unesco has had some 5 months to consider the FIAF Feasibility study on the establishment of an international centre for the moving image could FIAF raise the study with an appropriate person, perhaps Percy Stulz? It would be a great pity if the Study was allowed to drop our of sight which I am sure is very easy in Unesco.
