EDITOR'S REPORT (1984)

Microfiche services

Most of the problems which we faced during the first year of the microfiche operation have been ironed out. All the dispatches in 1984 were sent out on time, and the number of entries were considerably increased over 1983.

The final dispatch of the film service which was sent out in February 1985 cumulated 1982/84 on 39 fiches and recorded over 30,000 entries. In addition we introduced a cumulated index to the directors of all the films indexed in those years, on an extra fiche.

Instead of cumulating the television services 1983/84 as planned, we decided to produce a six-year cumulation listing all the entries from the beginning of the service in 1979 to the end of 1984. This has involved considerable re-editing to achieve consistency, but is now almost ready for microfilming.

Publications

The 1983 film volume was sent out to UK and non-North American standing orders on 16th October 1984. This continues the yearly improvement in publication date, in spite of a delay on this volume due to a binding error by the printer. This volume is the first to be printed in A4, soft-back, with an alphabetical rather than a classified arrangement of the General Subject section.

The 1981/82 television volume has been subject to unfortunate delays due to a lack of staff time for editing and paste-up work. It is now ready for the printer apart from the author index which is in process of compilation.

New editions of subject headings for both film and television are in preparation, and will be circulated to subscribers and indexers shortly.

Annual volume distribution

In March 1984 I was notified by the American Film Institute that they were no longer able to distribute the volumes for us in North America. Before we had decided on other arrangements we learnt that St James Press, who published our film volumes for 1974 and 1975, were now no longer tied to McMillans and were interested in marketing the current volumes world-wide. St James Press already have successful film reference books in their catalogue and will publicise our volumes alongside their own. We hope that increased sales will result and will make our arrangement with them worthwhile. Small changes have been made in the prices of the volumes on the advice of St James. Film volumes are now \$60 (USA), £37.50 (rest of the world). Television volumes \$37.50 and £25.00. Back volumes will be sold at the same prices as new ones.

Publicity

A new order form has been printed. As usual each year, a copy of this and the brochure will be sent to each archive, with a request to let us know how many copies they can dispose of to

likely subscribers or purchasers of volumes.

Selected mailings have been sent out during the year and will continue during 1985.

Staff

My assistant of three years Marie Nguyen left in September to return to her home in Paris. After advertising the post, and receiving over 100 applicants, I appointed Susan Oates, who started in October.

Supporters

Of the new supporters gained in Vienna only Amsterdam and Canberra actually contributed in 1984. As resolved at the last meeting the 10% increase in subscriptions to the microfiche services was not applied to supporters. The attached list sets out the position of support in 1985.
