Vice-President LINDGREN opened the session and, a quorum obtaining, declared the meeting valid.

The following Agenda was adopted :

1) Election of the Vice-Presidents
2) Designation of the Deputy Secretary-General and the Deputy 'Treasurer
3) Decision as to the time and place of the next meeting and Any Other Business

The Executive Committee unanimously elected, by the raising of hands :
Mr. Ernest LINDGREN - Vice-President
Mr. Victor PRIVATO - Vice-President
Mr. Willard VAN DYKE - Vice-President
The Executive Committee unanimously designated :
Mr. Vladimir POGACIC - Deputy Secretary-General
Mir. Herbert VOLKMANN - Deputy Treasurer
Reminding the Committee of the circumstances in which he had agreed to serve as Acting President in addition to fulfilling his own functions, Secretary-General LEDOUX urged the Committee to designate a Vice-President to replsceMr. TOEPLITZ until the end of the year. After discussion, the Executive Committee unanimously designated VicePresident Ernest LINDGREN as Acting President until the next Executive Committee meeting.

The Executive Committee unanimously agreed to buy from the Deutsche Kinemathek 40 copies of the German Silent Film Catalogue (Deutsche Stummfilme) at the price of DM 1500 and to supply copies to members at a cost of DM 50 each, giving help to those members unable to obtain foreign currencies; and to supply members and non-members with the Bibliography of Books and Periodicals Published Before 1914 at a cost of 5 dollars per copy.

The Executive Committee unanimously agreed to hold the next Executive Committee meeting on January 5-6-7 1968 in Amsterdam or, if possible, in Paris.

All points on the Agenda having been covered, Luting President Ernest LINDGRGN officially adjourned the meeting.
