MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY, the 9th JUNE, 1938, at the HOTEL CHATHAM, PARIS.

- 1. AGREEMENT. The International Agreement for the proposed INTERNATIONAL FEDERATION OF FILM ARCHIVES was discussed, and unanimously approved.
- 2. ANNUAL CONGRESS. It was proposed and agreed unanimously:

THAT the first Annual Congress be held in New York during the Summer of 1939: and the second Annual Congress be held in Berlin during the Summer of 1940.

3. ELECTION OF OFFICIALS. It was proposed and agreed unanimously:

THAT the following shall constitute the Board of Directors until the first Annual Congress in 1939:

Mr. John Abbott, United States of America. Mr. Frank Hensel, Germany. Mr. Henri Langlois, France. Miss Olwen Vaughan, England; and

That the following be elected officials of the International Federation of Film Archives to hold office until the first Annual Congress in 1939:

4. FINANCE. It was reported that the French Government had agreed to provide office accommodation and contribute the sum of Frs. 25,000 annually. After discussion it was proposed and agreed unanimously:

That the three remaining member countries should contribute jointly the sum of Prs. 25,000, making a total budget of Frs. 50,000 for the first year.

The following draft budget was then agreed:

Salary of Executive Secretary: Prs. 15,000. Salary of Stemographer: General Office expenses:

Frs. 10,000. Frs. 25,000 Frs. 50,000

The proceedings then terminated.
